

EPISODE PITCH: MOIRAI – EPISODE 2

Title: Moirai – Episode 2: "Punishment" Genre: Supernatural Thriller / Dark Fantasy Target Audience: Adult (18+), fans of dark, character-driven dramas with supernatural elements.

Series Logline: In a city where life and death are controlled by three immortal sisters known as the Moirai, the boundaries between human emotion and supernatural duty blur, as Victoria, Audrey, and Joey navigate their eternal responsibilities while confronting the chaos of mortal lives.

Episode Logline: In "Punishment," the aftermath of Victoria's recent execution weighs heavily on the sisters. Moments of light humor are interspersed among intense supernatural action. Themes include morality, guilt, loyalty, the cost of immortality, and the complexity of human desire.

Key Characters:

Victoria Kensington (Atropos): The decisive, haunted executor, wrestling with guilt and the moral weight of her actions.

Audrey Kensington (Lachesis): The grounded, meticulous sister who measures life and fate, struggling to reconcile love with family tension.

Joey Kensington (Clotho): The youngest sister, compassionate but restless, navigating mortal pleasures and responsibilities with curiosity and fear.

Kate & Frank: Human characters entangled with the sisters' world, highlighting emotional stakes and moral contrasts.
